Apologia Botany (5-8) (first of three trimesters): Exploring Creation with Botany (www.apologia.com) will introduce the student to Botany, taxonomy and the scientific method. There will be about two hours of homework per week, to include reading from the text and other sources, answering questions from the

text, and analysis of laboratory work done in the classroom. Grades will be based on lab work, homework assignments and chapter tests. Journaling is expected, but not graded. Students will need internet access for reading assignments, research, and homework. There is a \$5 lab fee.
